

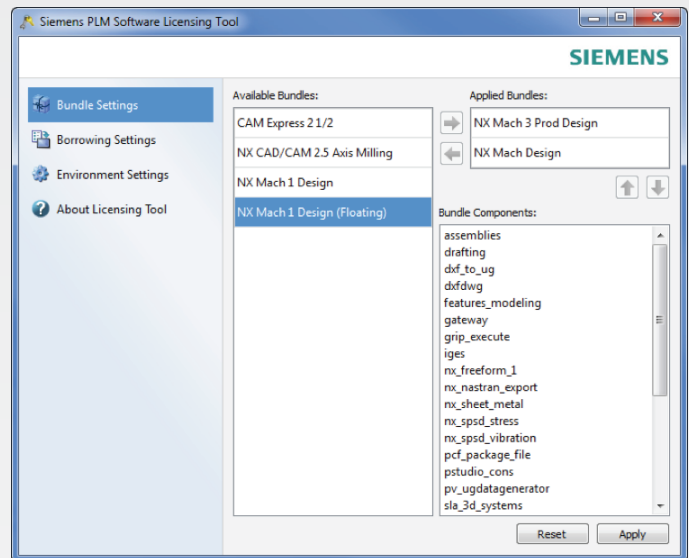
NX 10 Bundles

Prior to the release of NX10, you could specify the UGS_LICENSE_BUNDLE variable to set the bundle you wanted to use as your default.

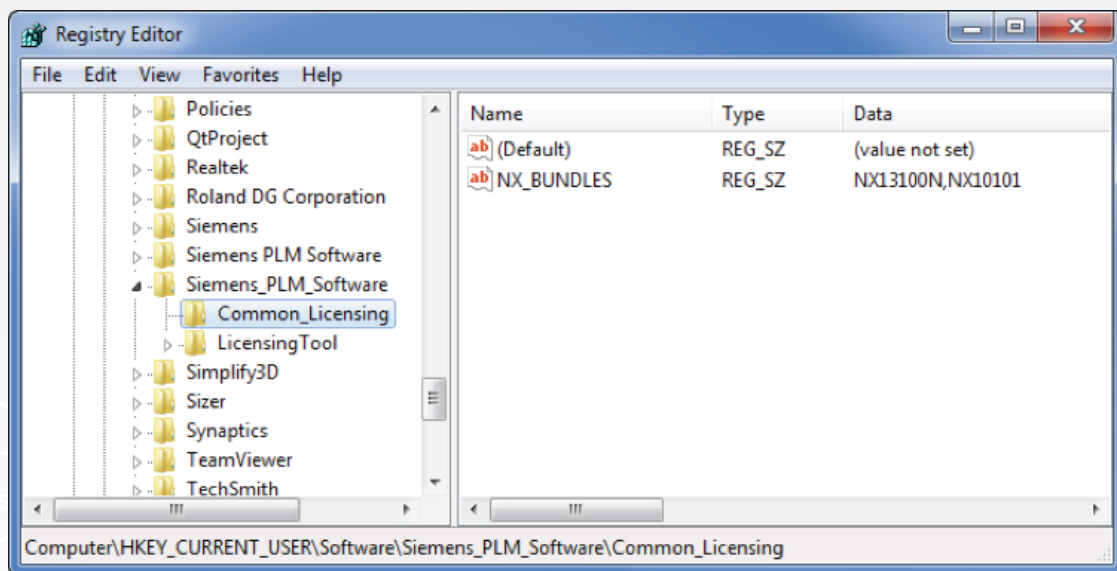
From NX10 and onwards the preference can now also be stored in the Windows registry.

If you use the NX Licensing Tool to specify your bundle (Start -> All Programs -> Siemens NX 10.0 -> NX Licensing Tools -> Licensing Tool), it will set the registry key for you.

If you have an advanced knowledge of Windows you can set the registry key directly:



(HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Siemens_PLM_Software\Common_Licensing) where you create a string called NX_BUNDLES with the value the bundles required.



If you still want to use the UGS_LICENSE_BUNDLE variable, that is still ok, just make sure that the registry key, HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Siemens_PLM_Software\Common_Licensing\NX_BUNDLES doesn't exist.

As long as that key exists (even if it has no value), NX10 will throw up a warning that there is no bundle available, regardless of what the environment variable is set to.
